
Summer Artwork for Rising Art 3 Students

This work is due on Friday, August 11.

All work should be completed in your sketchbook unless you choose to do acrylic or watercolor and need a heavy weight paper. Everyone needs to complete the # 4 Ring Ceremony Artwork and then choose 2 of the other options. I encourage you to complete all 4 assignments but you will only be graded on completion of 3 assignments (one being the Ring Ceremony artwork).


1. The Story of Food:

For this assignment you will be drawing the stages of a food of your choice being eaten. **You can use as many pages as you like or you can try to fit all drawings on a two page spread in your sketchbook.** In pencil first, sketch 5 stages of the food being eaten through observation (looking at it). You may take pictures of each stage if you must and draw from the photo. To complete your artwork; you can either shade in your food with graphite using a full range of values or you can use other media you have at home to complete; watercolor, ink pen, colored pencil, etc. Just be sure to add value to create form to your objects. If you use ink pen, you can add value with hatching/ crosshatching techniques.



2. Portrait:

Take a picture of a person (friend or family member- not a famous person) and draw a portrait of that person using graphite pencil. Try to pick a person with unique features or accessories that will make your drawing more interesting such as wrinkles, freckles, glasses, etc. Use all of your graphite pencils and knowledge of value and form to fully shade the portrait. Refer to powerschool for more information on drawing portraits and if you need help with value/gray scales. **This drawing should fill one entire page of your sketchbook.**




3. The Big Pile:


Make a big huge pile of similar items, these items should be things that you like, such as: all bones, all car keys, all shoes, all rusty wrenches, all hats, all hammers, all pies, all metal Mexican donkeys, etc.. Arrange the pile in an interesting way and shine a light on the pile to create highlights and shadows. Draw or paint the pile of objects, pay attention to proportion, detail, texture and color. If you have a pile of small items, such as car keys or acorns or plastic cows, enlarge them to make them interesting so that you don't have enormous negative space. Composition, detail and texture are important in this assignment. **This drawing/painting should be 8 x 10.**
